

2005 DELL-WINSTON SCHOOL SOLAR CAR CHALLENGE

Coming to your community



The Dell-Winston School Solar Car Challenge was established ten years ago to help motivate students in science and engineering. The Challenge, a part of The Winston School in Dallas, teaches high school students around the world how to build roadworthy solar cars. On even-numbered years, teams share the fun of the world famous **Texas Motor Speedway**; on odd-numbered years, teams drive cross-country to share their projects with millions of people.

The 2005 Dell-Winston Solar Challenge is a 1500-mile eight day race from the **Dell World Headquarters** in Round Rock, Texas to **NASA'S Jet Propulsion Lab** in Pasadena, California. Teams from New York, Minnesota, Mississippi, Texas, Colorado, Arizona, California, and Mexico are planning to take part in this year's event.

The Winston Solar Education Program provides curriculum materials, on-site visits, and workshop opportunities for high schools across the country.
